The Daroll & Dolores Frewing Scholarship is awarded to a BPAA member center owner's son, daughter or grandchild who achieves academic success and gives back to his/her community through service. One person will be selected to receive a \$25,000 scholarship, which will be managed through the International Bowling Museum Hall of Fame program. The Daroll & Dolores Frewing Scholarship will be formally presented each year at Bowl Expo. The BPAA will pay for travel and hotel expenses for the winner and one parent/guardian to attend the award ceremony. The selection is based on the candidate's grades, academics, community involvement, letters of reference, video and essays.

ELIGIBILITY AND REQUIREMENTS

1. Be in senior year of High School
2. BPAA member center and associated owner must be in good standing
3. Have a current GPA of 3.0 or better, based on a 4.0 scale
4. Completed application
5. Include at least two letters of reference (by teacher, principal, employer, etc.)
6. Include an official or unofficial school transcript
7. Include a video essay
8. Return completed documentation, video file, and application to the International Bowling Hall of Fame and Museum no later than April 17th, 2026 (partial or incomplete applications will not be accepted)

- Describe how you have worked as part of a leadership team in any other organization or group and what role you played. Describe how that experience will equip you if you receive this scholarship.
- If there is one person in the world dead or alive in which you could meet, who would that be and why?
